COFFEE TIME IS BACK!!!!!!



James Brown has received critical acclaim from CBC's Lauren Hancock, Producer of Saturday Night Jazz. His skills have been lauded by jazz writer and former Toronto Star editor Geoff Chapman and his modern jazz compositions have caught the eyes of several music industry rags, including The WholeNote and Making a Scene to name but a few. Beginning his musical exploration with rock guitarists and jazz players of the seventies like Jim Hall, Ed Bickert and John Abercrombie, Brown brought modern classical, neoclassical

and neoromantic influences to his craft. "I heard Bickert play at local clubs regularly in the 1990s and his style of playing was a revelation to me. As a classically trained musician who loved to compose, learning to improvise was irresistible," said Brown describing his early development.

One of Canada's most talented and versatile musicians, James Brown recently released his latest offering Song Within the Story. It's the fourth studio CD in his catalogue which spans a career of more than 30 years in the music business. Known for his blending of jazz rhythm section elements with more traditional classical instruments, Brown demonstrates the most distilled development of his personal composition style yet.

While the playlist contains an interesting selection of catchy upbeat melodies, there is a distinct bluesy undertone to the work. James also pays homage to a couple of favourite Canadian singer/songwriters with a moving version of Neil Young's The Needle and the Damage Done and a soulful rendition of A Case of You by Joni Mitchell.

After spending the summer touring the new music around the country, James Brown will bring his latest synthesis of jazz and European classical music to Markdale on Friday, November 25. Bandmates Mike Murley on tenor sax and Clark Johnston on bass will join him on stage at Annesley United Church for an evening of some very cool sounds. Music in Middle Grey begins at 7 pm. My husband Peter and I have lived in the Grey/Bruce area for 32 years. We presently reside in the Mobile Home section of LutheRanch, a church-based camp. We lived and worked in Kitchener/Waterloo for the first 13 years of our marriage. We have been married for 46 years and throughout our association with LutheRanch, since its inception in 1973 as a camp, we have served on the worship committee and I have been the organist and pianist on a volunteer basis for summer services. We have three sons and seven grandchildren.

I was brought up and trained musically in the Lutheran Church. The Kitchener/Waterloo area is rich with German Lutheran heritage and very strong musically. I was privileged to have had the opportunity to start my church musical training at a young age of 7 through one of the only Choir Schools within a Lutheran Church in Canada, St. John's Lutheran in Waterloo. At this school we learned history of church music, theory, singing and choral technique. We had examinations and special concerts.

I started my piano training with Joseph Herdman. He was organist and choir director for a short time at St. John's. He was my first junior choir director. When he left St. John's, Mr. Douglas Campbell became the Director of Music and also the founder of the Choir School. I credit my church music training to this man as he instilled in me a love for the music ministry of the church.

I was heavily involved during high school years playing in the bands, singing in the choirs and on stage in musicals. I received the Music Merit Awards for both my Grade 12 and Grade 13 years. I continued my piano studies with Douglas Campbell, earning my ARCT Piano Performance from the Western Conservatory of Music. I enrolled at McMaster University in the Music program where I majored in piano and vocal. During that time I was employed part time at a music store in Waterloo as an organ teacher and became full time eventually in sales of organs and pianos and taught for the store.

From the mid 70's until 1990 I had positions of Organist and Choir director for various Lutheran churches in the KW area and an interim position at Emmanuel United in Waterloo, until we moved north to Grey/Bruce. After a short hiatus I became Organist and Choir Director for St. Peter's Lutheran and Trinity Anglican in Wiarton. (Continued on page 9)

In 2002, I took another hiatus from church music to become Music Director for the Owen Sound Little Theatre for their fall musicals. As a fund raiser for the OSLT, I developed and directed The Sound Troupe, which was a group dedicated to performing for community events such as Dance for Life, the Olympic Torch Run, Western Ontario Drama League Awards Dinner, Chamber of Commerce Awards Dinner and entertained at Cobble Beach. I was an accompanist for the Youth Theatre Coalition in Owen Sound, accompanied and eventually directed the Sauble Singers, sang with A Cappella Chamber Choir in Port Elgin, and assisted the West Hill Secondary School music teacher (Henrietta Blom) with accompanying the choirs for festival and performing in Music Theatre class musical productions. I have taught piano and organ lessons for 45 years privately, and piano and vocal in Bluewater public and high schools. returned to church music with a short employment with Southampton United Church before moving again in 2011. An opportunity arose for part time work as organist at the Lutheran Church of Our Savior in Owen Sound which eventually turned into full time Organist and Choir Director. I was there for approximately 6 years when an offer came from the Regional Ministry of Saugeen Shores of the Anglican church for two of the parishes, one in Southampton and the other Port Elgin which I couldn't refuse and am currently employed there.

I have been a church musician all my life no matter where my family has moved. I will continue to express my faith through the music ministry of any church we attend.


